

TAMBO POOL SHADE STRUCTURE

The Tambo Pool Shade Structure has been completed and is the final project that was funded by 2020-21 COVID Works for Queensland Program.



Council acknowledges the funding by Queensland Government which has provided much needed economic stimulus to the regional economy. Some of the earlier projects completed under this program included: Water reticulation renewals, Sewerage mains camera audit and upgrades, Blackall Rugby League dressing rooms upgrades, Saleyards Selling pens, Pathway to Health, Tambo Weighbridge upgrades and Waste Oil collection stations.

Home renovators and tradespeople have a legal responsibility to make sure they protect their own and others' health by not releasing asbestos fibers during their work. Before you disturb any building material you must check whether it is likely to contain asbestos (or assume it does). To remove any doubt, get a sample tested for asbestos. Laboratories that analyse building materials for asbestos can be found by contacting the National Association of Testing Authorities.

Residents are strongly encouraged to always take precautionary measures when uncertain if any materials contain asbestos. Householders may carry out minor repairs on asbestos cement materials, as long as the recommended safety precautions for these activities are followed.

Please be aware that Blackall Tambo Regional Council's Waste facilities are not authorised to accept asbestos.
