

BTRC formalises working arrangement upon parole

At a Rural Aid Community workshop held in Blackall, participants listed the Work Camp number five in the top things they valued in the region.

The QCS Work Camp has been operating in the area since 1992, assisting local sporting groups, church groups and community associations (and council itself) with invaluable assistance.

At Council's February meeting Council adopted the following policy statement:

Blackall-Tambo Regional Council proudly provides assistance to Queensland Corrective Service in the operation of a low security work camp in the Blackall-Tambo Region.

Prisoners provide immense and much needed assistance to Council and the community in a variety of tasks. The Work Camp Program is in high demand from local sporting groups, church groups and community associations across the Blackall-Tambo region.

Council values the important partnership it has with Queensland Corrective Services and is committed to the rehabilitation of participants in the Work Camp Program.

Upon the support of Oueensland Corrective Services, Council may, on occasion, offer fixed term employment, where a job is available, to a suitable releasee, to assist in that person's reintegration into society.

The Policy Statement formalises the Council's declaration of its commitment in assisting rehabilitation to those in the Work Camp Program.

There are 13 work camps operating throughout Queensland and the model of the Blackall Camp is regarded as a measure of best practice. It is hoped that other councils may follow Blackall's lead and introduce similar employment policies, if not already doing so, proving how valuable and beneficial these formal endorsements can be to both those on parole and to the community who is embracing their rehabilitation
