DOG REGISTRATIONS & RENEWALS

REGIONAL WORKS

Heavy Vehicle Bypass update

The Heavy Vehicle Bypass project is now nearing completion with the signage all installed and safety measures in place, works are currently being undertaken on Violet Street to rectify historical wear and tear from turning heavy vehicles. Some parts of the bypass have now been opened to the public with all of the remaining works scheduled to be completed in the coming days there will be no further delay to the full opening of the bypass which will occur before the end of February. Council has installed Variable Message Signs on the National Highway to alert traffic of the roadworks, these will be changed to indicate opening and remain in place for a period of time once the works are completed.

Tambo Pool update

The Tambo Pool has been closed since the 16th of December due to the ongoing issue with existing pool pumps struggling and eventually failing to circulate water correctly. The pool was closed as this created a health risk to the community and until remedied the existence of pathogens could not be avoided. The pumps and electrical work have been upgraded to now exceed the required levels of flow. The understanding is that this will rectify any issue with the circulation of water and necessary chemicals in the pool system. The new pumps have arrived and are being installed next week, the pool has been dosed with necessary chemical and now it is only a matter of time before it returns to the safe state free of any unknown pathogens. The expectation is that the pool will be open within a fortnight of installation and the remainder of the swim season will not be impacted in any way.

Shamrock Street median strip

The Blackall-Tambo Regional Council will be upgrading the Blackall median strip in Shamrock Street. The goal of this project is to address safety by having a consistent kerb height throughout the entire median. An alternative objective is to renovate the main street where possible and provide a much needed facelift to the primary town corridor. This project will be occurring over several months with major construction works not scheduled until April.

The construction will involve the pouring of concrete throughout the main street and will require earthmoving equipment. To minimise issues for traffic and parking

these works will be undertaken in stages. There are currently four medians with parking on both sides, when the works are undertaken Council will be required to shut down the parking in one section at a time to make room for equipment but still allow traffic flow. There will be no stop/slow unless necessary however parking will be slightly restricted with one side of each median being completed at each time. This will allow the remaining seven sections of parking to be utilised as parking throughout the project.

Prior to the commencement of any works Council will notify the township through various forms of media.
