BARKING DOGS

All dogs bark on occasion for various reasons however, dogs that bark excessively cause a nuisance to the community. If you have a barking dog in your street or neighbourhood, the first thing you should do is talk to your neighbours about any noise issues that are affecting you. They may not be aware their pet is causing a problem. If you don't feel comfortable doing this or are unable to speak to your neighbour face-to-face, drop a letter in their mailbox alerting them to your concerns. Allow sufficient time for the dog owner to rectify the problem.

If the barking continues to be a problem after this time and can't be solved by talking to the dog owner, you can report the problem to Council. Please provide as much information as possible:

- Correct address of where the dog is kept
- Description of the dog
- Detailed list of dates, time and possible causes for the dogs barking
- How the barking is affecting you

Keep Council informed—give the owner some time to resolve the problem and let us know what happens. Keep complete and detailed records—keep an animal noise diary of when the dog barks and how long the barking continues.

Council has barking collars available for hire by owners who need assistance to train their dogs.

- Refundable deposit—\$200.00
- Cost to hire—\$2.00 per day
