REGIONAL WORKS

Shamrock Street Median Strip

The upgrades to the Blackall Median Strip have commenced. The works will progressively move down Shamrock Street and incorporate all four sections of median strip. Project completion for concrete works is anticipated in July 2023. During this period the parking bays will be utilised for through traffic; please be mindful of changed traffic conditions and Council workers when driving through the jobsite.

Blackall-Jericho Road Widening and Rehabilitation

The Blackall Jericho Road is now under side track and changed traffic conditions as you enter town. This is due to the commencement of a full widening and rehabilitation of the pavement from Salvia Street to the Douglas Ponds. This entire section will be 8m wide bitumen upon completion and allow all weather access along the Blackall-Jericho Road.

Blackall-Isisford Road Rehabilitation

First seal is now complete on the Blackall-Isisford Road and the rehabilitated section of road is open to traffic.

STUDENTS ATTEND COUNCIL MEETING

Blackall-Tambo Regional Council had the pleasure of hosting the 4/5/6 students from St Joseph's Catholic Primary School at the May general meeting.

The students, while not able to attend the meeting in Tambo, were able to link in via videoconferencing at the Blackall Boardroom.

The children are learning about local government and the Councillors were eager to provide the opportunity for the students to witness how Council meetings function.

The Mayor, Cr Andrew Martin, later attended the school to answer any questions from the up-and-coming politicians, Local, Federal, and State.

Blackall-Tambo Regional Council is very keen to engage with all ages from all the schools and would be more than happy to arrange visitations to Council meetings virtually or, where practical, face to face.

MAY COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- ~Council has approved a co-contribution to leverage funding for the Regional Arts Development Fund (RADF) Program.
- ~ Council endorsed the RADF Strategic Initiatives Funding of \$15,000 to the Red Ridge youth dance program Bush Beatz.
- ~Boral Resources (QLD) Pty Ltd was awarded tenders for bituminous products for various projects.
- \sim Webster's Select Timber's Trust was awarded the tender, subject to approval from the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries, for the sale of Council's Sales Permit and Tambo Sawmill.
- ~The section of road between Violet and St Andrew Streets in Blackall has been named East Walter Street.
- Council has agreed to have the buildings at 63 and 67 Shamrock St, Blackall demolished.
