Another busy month for Blackall-Tambo Regional Council

It has been another busy month for Blackall-Tambo Regional Council.

It released its list of successful recipients for its first round of the inaugural **Community Grants Program** and was thrilled to be able to award all 13 applicants who applied the funding they requested. Over \$76,000 in funding was awarded which equates to a total community value of over \$230,000.

Council is proud of its investment in local projects, events and initiatives run by the region's local clubs and organisations.

Back in July BTRC invited not-for-profit organisations to apply for funding for a particular project or program starting from as little as \$500 and up to a maximum of \$15,000.

The In-Kind program is still being run as a separate stream of assistance available to community groups.

Two rounds of these Community Grants Program will be offered each year and Round 2 opens in February next year.

Meanwhile applications for Round 2 of the 2025-2026 **Regional Arts Development Fund (RADF)** are being sought. This stream of funding, a collaboration between Council and the State Government, closes on 29th October.

Successful sports applicants with the Community Grants Program were: Tambo Cricket Club who need to purchase a container for storage; the Blackall Pistol Club for disability access to their facility; funding for swim coaching clinics; Tour de Tambo Cycling Event; Enhancements to the canteen at Tambo Pony Club; and Blackall's Beef Producer's Race Day.

Tambo ICPA were successful in obtaining funding for camp activities for their students.

Both the Blackall Historical Woolscour and the Tambo Heritage Group were successfull as well. The BHW for training for its volunteers and THG for new display cabinets.

Bushman's Gallery will be hosting a Melbourne Cup Day Luncheon and a retaining wall will be replaced at Barcoo Retirement Village. Blackall's RSL Sub Branch was also successful, along with two of Blackall's wonderful annual events, St Patrick's Fete and the Annual Christmas Tree Festival.

Magpie Season

Magpies swoop, it is a defensive behaviour they use to protect their eggs and young during the breeding season, which typically occurs between August and November.

Identify Nesting Areas: Be aware of where magpies are nesting and avoid these areas during the spring months.

Use Warning Signs: If you discover a swooping area, you can place a temporary sign up to warn others or post on the Community page on Facebook.

And remember Magpies are protected, it is illegal to harm them or their young.

New PET SAFETY ALERT - IF A PET INGESTS 1080 BAIT

.Seek veterinary help immediately or call the Australian Animal Poisons Helpline on \$\\$1300 869 738.

Induce vomiting (only if the pet is conscious and not showing symptoms) using table salt (1–3 tbsp) or dilute hydrogen peroxide (3–5ml)

There is no antidote for 1080 poisoning. Early treatment is critical and may include seizure control, IV fluids, and respiratory support.
